Practical resources to help Wiltshire secondary schools protect children and young people from sexual exploitation.

Schools are well placed to teach pupils how to make positive choices and informed decisions in their relationships to build resilience and reduce vulnerability to sexual exploitation.

Kaleidoscope (2010)

This Wiltshire Key Stage 3 PSHE education scheme of work includes a focus on sex and relationships education. Kaleidoscope promotes the teaching of healthy relationships as well as key messages relating to e-safety, anti-bullying, assessing risk and keeping safe.

Exposed

This 10 minute film helps young people to explore the feelings and attitudes that can lead to them sending nude images. Learners will be able to examine the responsibilities of partners towards each other and the way one mistake can have long-term repercussions.

Tom's Story

This 5 minute film, with session plan and PowerPoint, is aimed at children aged 11-13 and covers the sensitive topic of contact sexual abuse which some learners may find distressing. • Consequences (2010)

This 8 minute film for 11-13 year olds reinforces the importance of keeping personal information and images private.
