Swindon and Wiltshire Intervention for Families to Thrive (SWIFT)

This is a consent-based programme run within Wiltshire Police which aims to reduce children coming to police notice and to prevent them becoming part of the criminal justice system. For more details, please contact us by email.

People Who Help Us/Keeping Safe – Key Stage 1, ages 4-5

This session will introduce the little ones to the police and allow them to have a look inside of a police vehicle!

Personal and Online Safety – Key Stage 2, ages 9-10

The online and outside world is moving incredibly fast and before children leave for secondary school, we need them to learn how to keep safe, both online and when they are out and about.

Sexting and Healthy Relationships -Key Stage 3 (KS3) - Ages 12-13

What is Sexting and what does a healthy relationship look like? We will talk about what the norm is for children their age rather than what they might think it is...

Keeping Safe - Exploitation and Vulnerability - Key Stage 3/4 (KS3/4) -Ages 12+

What is exploitation? What does it look like? Who can I talk to if I have concerns for a friend? These are frequent questions that we are asked and what better way than answering those questions with an interactive input from the police.
