Thank you for taking the time to read our offer leaflet. So, what will you get from reading this? You will find out everything that we offer to all schools across Wiltshire and Swindon and where to go to if you have any questions.

To access our programmes it is important that you read, sign and provide the school's single point of contact (SPOC) details on the service level agreement. This outlines the expectations that we should have from each other in a professional working relationship.

Now for what you are really interested in... what we can provide to you and your students.

Swindon and Wiltshire Intervention for Families to Thrive (SWIFT):

This is a consent-based programme run within Wiltshire Police which aims to reduce children coming to police notice and to prevent them becoming part of the criminal justice system. For more details please contact us by email.

Primary School:

People Who Help Us / Keeping Safe - Key Stage 1 (KS1) - Ages 4-5

This session will introduce the little ones to the police and allow them to have a look inside of a police vehicle!

Personal and Online Safety - Key Stage 2 (KS2) - Ages 9-10

The online and outside world is moving incredibly fast and before children leave for secondary school, we need them to learn how to keep safe, both online and when they are out and about.

Secondary School:

Sexting and Healthy Relationships - Key Stage 3 (KS3) Yr8 – Age 12 - 13

What is Sexting and what does a healthy relationship actually look like? We will let them know what the norm is for children their age rather than what they might think it is...

Keeping Safe - Exploitation and Vulnerability - Key Stage 3 (KS3) Yr9 - Ages 13 - 14

What is exploitation? What does it look like? Who can I talk to if I have concerns for a friend? These are common questions that we are asked and what better way than answering those questions with an interactive input from the police.

Targeted offers:

We recognize as a force that in some situations a more targeted approach is needed towards some subject areas. Below is a list of our current targeted offers. These are only offered when we, as a team, feel it is appropriate.

- Substance Misuse.
- The Role of the Police.
- Weapons Awareness and Exploitation.
