## Voice of Schools Survey 2023 – SEND

Dear Colleague,

Firstly, thank you for taking the time to read this letter as we know how busy everyone is as we start the lead up to Christmas.

We are writing to you on behalf of SCISS NEAC (Service Children in State Schools National Executive Advisory Committee) with some exciting news - and fully appreciate that some of you may never have heard about us or the SCISS organisation!

Briefly, the SCISS NEAC is the 'Voice of Schools' supporting Service children across England and we have been established for almost 20 years. The committee comprises a range of professionals who work with Service families. Over the years, the SCISS NEAC has been instrumental in influencing appropriate government bodies for policy change in support of Service children with one of the successes being the Service Pupil Premium grant.
