- Mental health must be tackled within schools. Young people cannot turn into adults without being able to understand what it's like to be afflicted by poor mental health. Schools need to show students ways to signpost poor mental health and remove the stigma behind it created by the media. Tackling this problem at a younger age may lead to more openness about the mental health and that it is not something to laugh at. - There is a genuine need for people to learn life skills such as dealing with banks and maintaining a car.
