## What is hate crime?

A hate crime is any unacceptable behavior that a person thinks has been caused by the hostility, prejudice or hatred of others against them or their property. This may be because of their:

- Race Skin colour, nationality, ethnicity or heritage
- Religion Faith or belief including agnostics and atheists
- Gender Male, female or non-binary
- **Gender identity** Transgender, birth gender, gender variance, questioning
- Sexual orientation Lesbian, bisexual, gay, heterosexual, questioning
- **Disability** Physical, learning disability, autism, hearing loss, visual impairment, mental health.

Hate crime can happen in many different ways, it could be:

- verbal abuse and name-calling or
- threats or intimidation or
- physical attacks or violence sexual violence and murder or
- graffiti or abusive writing or
- damage to property, including arson or
- bullying or harassment or
- online trolling

## **Core principles**

To prevent hate crime in Wiltshire and Swindon the group will focus on the following core principles:

- Increase awareness and understanding of hate crime
- Promote community cohesion
- Increase reporting and access to support
- Improve the response to hate crime

This strategy together with a supporting action plan aims to deliver the following improvements to those victims and communities affected by hate crime.

- Build trust and confidence of those affected by hate crime
- Bring offenders to justice
- Promote community cohesion together with partner agencies
- Work with partner agencies to improve services to victims of hate crime creating high quality victim support
- Increase reporting of hate crime and hate incidents and reduce under reporting
- Establish a better understanding of the nature and extent of hate crime and raise awareness
