Scooter Skills Safety Training: Scootability Moving with the tir

Moving with the times and due to the

increase in children travelling to school by scooter Wiltshire Council Road Safety Team offer

<u>1-hour</u> fun-based scooter skills safety sessions to Wiltshire Primary schools.

It is offered to all Primary school pupils from Year 1 to Year 6, each session is adapted to suit the needs and ability of each age group.

We are especially targeting Year 3 upwards who may be travelling independently to/from school and taking more risks in and around traffic.

The skills are taught by a **Road Safety Officer** through discussion, demonstration and replication by the children. **There is a nominal cost of £5.30 per pupil. Each school and pupil receive a participation certificate.**

Topics covered, discussed and demonstrated during session:

*Safety Clothing and equipment



*Scooter maintenance check.

*Sharing the footway/pavement safely and safest side to scoot.

* Responsible and safe scooting.

*Hazards to look out for.

*Where to scoot, where not to scoot.

*Demonstrating three ways to stop, balance skills and control manoeuvring around a structured course.

We will acknowledge your request and contact the school to arrange mutually convenient dates and times for training.

Protocol for Scooter Skills Safety Training in schools:

These guidelines outline the responsibilities for the visiting member of the road safety team and for the school.

The school's preparation for the visit:

- To agree **sole use** of the training site (usually the school playground/tennis courts etc) for the agreed date and session times.
- All teaching staff informed of date, session times and pupils taking part.
- Teaching staff to be responsible for bringing pupils out to training site **on time** for the start of the one-hour session. Ready with appropriate clothing, helmet if worn and scooters.
- The class teacher or teaching assistant should plan to be present at the session so that they can deal with any follow up questions or concerns, when appropriate provide a member of staff if a pupil usually has one to one teaching assistance.
- School to remind pupils/parents/carers the day before Scootability is booked to bring their scooters, helmets if owned, appropriate clothing to school with them for the session.

The road safety team's preparation for the visit:

- The training site will be risk assessed prior to each session.
- Road safety staff understand the needs and emotional and intellectual levels of the children involved and will communicate at the appropriate level delivering a session to suit the pupil's ability/needs.
- Fluorescent/reflective tabards will be provided for children to wear during the training.
- Spare scooters will be provided should scooters be forgotten on the day or a scooter fails the maintenance check.
- The road safety team may cancel the session if weather conditions are unsuitable for training purposes.
